Brazil – Early Colonists from Glarus

Coming to Brazil

Brazil was stylized in the middle of the 19th century as the earthly paradise and land of plenty. The cultivation of coffee was regarded as a symbol of the prosperity to be gained from afar. Between 1852 and 1857, some 2000 Swiss emigrated to the province of Sao Paulo in Brazil, where they worked as coffee pickers on 25 coffee plantations spread over 25 different areas. They had been forced to emigrate by crop failures and famine. The reality in Brazil, on the other hand, was different - the paradise in their minds quickly gave way to the hard daily life on the plantations. Under pressure from the growing international criticism of slavery, since the 1840s Brazil had been trying to replace slaves with colonists who were to manage the coffee plantations as sharecroppers. Long accustomed to keeping slaves, however, the Swiss were also treated unfairly. The emigrants hardly had a chance to pay their debts and become free farmers. As a result, there was a revolt against the working and living conditions imposed on them, which escalated into a Swiss state affair and emigration to Brazil quickly dried up.

The first known group of Glarus colonist mainly from Engi and Matt left Hamburg for Santos in July 1853. They all went to the coffee plantation farm Ibicaba after they arrived in Santos. During the trip, from the 163 passengers, 15 died from cholera.





The family settled in the coffee plantation farm Ibicaba after they arrived in Santos. Margaretha gave birth to Katharina, born in Ibicaba. After getting sick at Paredes, they were moved up the river. Margaretha died in a place called Boa Vista between March and May 1858. Some time later, Johannes married Regula Volkart, born around 1835, from Niederglatt (Zurich). Regula Volkart arrived at Ibicaba by the same boat as Johannes Schlittler and his family, She was still single and Jacob Volkart was her brother (the boat list is wrong) She got married in Ibicaba with Leonhard Gottschall (her relative, also from Niederglatt, Zurich). Regula and Leonhard went to Mucury and Leonhard died at the same place and around the same time time as Johannes' wife (in Boa Vista). Johann Schlittler and Regula got married and they had a child in Mucury, before 1861. In October 1863, all the family (Johannes, Regula, Katherina and the new child) came back to Rio de Janeiro and moved to Rio Grande do Sul.

Thomas Davatz (1815-1888) was schoolmaster in Fanas, Fideris and Malans in the Swiss canton of Graubünden. In 1854 he decided to emigrate to America. His original idea was to settle in the USA. As a result of the positive official propaganda of the government he finally decided to settle in Brazil. Together with a group of compatriots from Graubünden, but also from Glarus, Aargau and other parts of Switzerland, he boarded the sailing ship "Kronprinz Ernst August" in Hamburg on April 20, 1855, with which he arrived in Santos on June 15, 1855 after a little more than 7 weeks. The group was hired by the colonization company of Senator Nicolau de Campos Vergueiro. Some of the settlers were led to the Ibicaba estate and others to the Angelica estate which both were in the state of São Paulo. Both colonies belonged to Senator Vergueiro where he had coffee grown.

Additional Information about the Colonists from Glarus

(with the friendly help of Marillia Jordan)

After the Ibicaba's rebellion in December 1856, some Swiss families were forced to leave the farm. With the help of the consul in Rio de Janeiro, nine families coming from Aargau, Fribourg, Glarus, Graubünden and Zurich, arrived in Rio de Janeiro in the last months of 1857 and set off for the Mucuri Colony in Minas Gerais. There were 35 persons in the group, 13 of whom from Glarus.

Although most of them went to Mucuri in December 1857, Daniel Schlittler, his wife and 4 children, travelled three months later, in March 1858. Although his debt was already paid, he didn't leave Ibicaba immediately. He came to Rio de Janeiro only in September 1857, and he was alone. His wife Margaretha had given birth shortly before (baby Daniel), so she stayed behind with the children.

In October, Daniel travelled to the Mucury Colony probably to see by himself the way the colons were living there. Everything seemed alright so he came back, went to São Paulo, and brought his family to Rio. At Mucury, he learned that the rainy season was due to start soon. He had some savings and chose to stay in Rio until the rain was over. The other settlers who were beginning to arrive in Rio de Janeiro had no such choice. They had no money, only debts. They depended on the help of the Swiss Benevolent Society, so they left Rio de Janeiro by the December Steamer.

Among those 29 persons coming from Ibicaba, 7 came from Glarus:

Johannes Schlittler (3 persons), Pankratius Schlittler (single), Caspar Schlittler (2 persons) and Anna Barbara Schlittler. (Anna Barbara was already married to someone from Aargau and was no longer considered to be from Glarus)

When this group arrived at Mucuri, they all stayed at the warehouse of Paredes, got sick of malaria and some of them died there or after moving upriver.

Johannes Schlittler (1829 -?) travelled with his wife Margaretha Marti and their young daughter Katharina, born in Ibicaba. After getting sick at Paredes, they were moved up the river. Margaretha died in a place called Boa Vista between March and May 1858. Sometime later, Johannes married Regula Volkart, born around 1835, from Niederglatt (Zurich).

Regula arrived at Ibicaba by the same boat as Johannes Schlittler and his family, she was still single and Jacob Volkart was her brother (the boat list is wrong). She got married in Ibicaba with Leonhard Gottschall (her relative, also from Niederglatt, Zurich). Regula and Leonhard went to Mucury and Leonhard died at the same place and around the same time time as Johannes' wife (Boa Vista). Johann Schlittler and Regula got married and they had a child in Mucury, before 1861. In October 1863, all the family (Johannes, Regula, Katherina and the new child) came back to Rio de Janeiro and moved to Rio Grande do Sul.

Caspar Schlittler (1825 -1858) brother of Daniel Schlittler. He got married in Ibicaba to a certain Margaretta (I haven't found her family name and I'm not sure if the first name is right). They both died in Paredes. Margaretta was pregnant. She died on 25 January 1858, the newborn the next day and Caspar on 31 January 1858.

Anna Barbara Schlittler (1834 -1858) sister of Daniel Schlittler. She also got married in Ibicaba. Her husband was named Caspar Märki, from Mandach, Aargau, and born around 1828. Anna Barbara was also pregnant, and the child was born in Paredes in early 1858. Shortly after the birth, they were transferred to a village not far up the river (Santa Clara, nowa days city of Nanuque, MG), but all three were very ill. The baby died on 17 April 1858, Anna Barbara's husband (Caspar Märki) on 7 April 1858 and Anna Barbara on 5 May 1858.


Burkhard Pankratius Schlittler (1824 -1887) brother of Daniel Schlittler. He was single when he arrived but got married to Margaretha Maisch (1836 - 1880) from Saeull, Luxembourg. They had three children. The loss of his sister and brother affected Pankratius much more than Daniel. Probably because he had seen them die along with their partners and babies. People used to say that he was a strange man.

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This place called "Paredes" no longer exists and today nobody knows where it was. It was just a place by the river, where the boat could stop when the water level was too low to allow the steamer to continue to the port of Santa Clara. The place had a warehouse that could accommodate goods and passengers, but nobody lived there.

Marillia put a map below, so one can see where all those people stayed and died. Malaria was endemic the first 120 km of the road, till the Military Camp (Colonia Militar do Urucu). Some other settlers from Ibicaba that went to the place named Ribeirão da Areia, just after Boa Vista, thats why you'll find name on the map.

Daniel, Johannes and Pankratius stayed in Boa Vista for a while, before moving to the healthier side of the colony (and the road). In 1861, they were living near Filadelfia (nowadays the city of Teófilo Otoni)
